IM Autumn Workshop 2007

Teaching conversation to low-level Japanese students

Kyoto University – November 3rd, 2007

The Immediate Method is a simple and powerful conversation classroom management technique that was created in Japan in response to several challenging situations: (1) large classes; (2) low levels of language ability and motivation, and (3) the reticent classroom behavior of Japanese learners.

Its primary objective is to have the students learn to speak in two-way, real-time communication; in short, to take part in spontaneous, free flowing conversations. Born in the context of university-level French conversation classes, it has been successfully applied to conversation teaching in English, German and Japanese at various levels.

The Immediate Method (IM) Autumn Workshop is an annual event that brings together foreign language teachers from all over Japan to learn and exchange ideas about conversation teaching. Over the past seven years, we have held the Workshop at venues such as Osaka University, Kyoto University and Rikkyo University, and introduced many teachers to the IM and its possibilities.

The workshop is organized by:

- The Research Group for Teaching Conversation in Japan, an informal group of teachers who have been conducting teacher training, writing articles about conversation teaching in Japan, and publishing research on the topic since 1999.
- Alma Publisher, a small publishing company specializing in IM-compatible conversation textbooks.

TRAINING

Cultural codes: How to break the barrier of silence in class \geq

We all know that Japanese culture is not conducive to free, spontaneous expression in conversation classes. While it is helpful to know that general cultural factors are at play, this doesn't help teachers when it comes to actually conducting a class. Action must be based on more precise descriptions of cultural processes and simple, easily executable guidelines. We will explain:

- how to break the "barrier of silence" in the classroom
- how to integrate pragmatic competence into our students' learning, helping them to sound "natural" in English (in effect, teaching them to respect the cultural codes that govern oral expression in English).

Introduction to the Immediate Method

We will explain the fundamentals of the method, show a class video, and proceed with a short simulation class in which participants will be asked to take on the role of learners of a language other than English. We will then discuss the different aspects of this approach, mostly from the practical side (issues of time management, marking, etc.).

SHARING

The Immediate Method applied to different teaching contexts \triangleright

Teachers using the IM in various contexts (class size, students' levels, JHS or university, etc.) share their experiences and invite questions and discussion. This is always a much-appreciated part of the Autumn Workshop, and is the reason we call this a workshop; the idea is that there is not one set way to do things, and that we benefit from sharing our experience and ideas. Presentations are practical and discussions are friendly.

\geq **Dinner party**

Those who would like to are welcome to join us for an early dinner party (set course for about 3,000 yen, reservations must be made in advance). We can also provide information about reasonably-priced accommodation for participants arriving on Friday night or extending their stay until Sunday for a little sightseeing. Hotel reservations should be made as early as possible, this being the most visited city in Japan. Kyoto University is located in one of the most scenic parts of Kyoto, with many beautiful and famous spots a stone's throw away from our venue.


